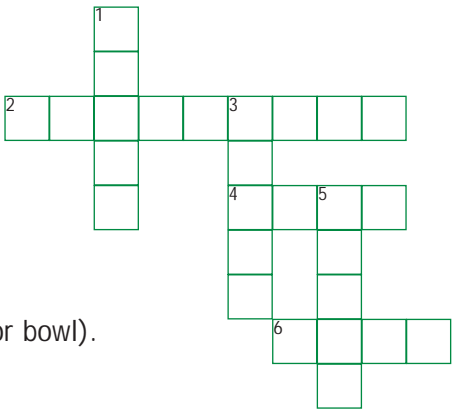

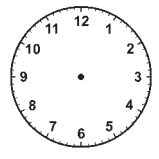

The Jews started their day at 6 o'clock in the morning, so their 3rd hour was our 9 o'clock in the morning; their 6th hour was our midday (12 noon).

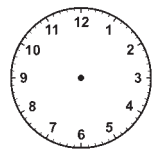
